

AROCA NSW SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS 2018

1. Administration

1.1 The Event

The Event will be known as **The AROCA Navigation Assembly** herein after referred to as the Event and will be a Multi Club Touring Assembly. The Event will be conducted on public roads in the Southern Highlands of NSW on Sunday 24th June 2018. The Event is conducted by the Alfa Romeo Owners Club of NSW and is a round of the Classic Rally Club Inc 2018 Championship series.

The Event will be run in four categories:

Masters, Apprentices, Tour and Social Tour

Different instructions may be used for each category. Participants in the SOCIAL RUN will get the same instructions as for Tour but will not be eligible to score points in the CRC Championship.

1.2 Crews will lose points associated with errors and/or omissions as described in Section 10.2 .

1.3 Authority and Permit

This Event will be conducted under the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices and the National Competition Rules (NCR's) of the Confederation of Australian Motor Sport Ltd (CAMS), CAMS National Touring Code, the CAMS Motor Sport Passenger Ride Activity Policy, these Supplementary Regulations, and any Further Regulations or Instructions which may be issued. This Event will be conducted under and in accordance with CAMS OH&S and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the CAMS website at www.cams.com.au

The Touring Assembly will be held under CAMS Permit Number- 218/2406/02

The SOCIAL RUN will be held under CAMS Permit Number-Social permit granted by CAMS

2 Crews and Entries

2.1

This Event will include a Motor Sport Passenger Ride Activity (MSPRA) which shall be run under and in accordance with the CAMS MSPRA Policy.

- (a) A briefing must be attended by each Driver and Passenger (and guardians of each Passenger if Passenger is under 18 years of age) conducted by the Clerk of the Course prior to the MSPRA commencing.
- (b) Passengers MUST:
 - i. wear the same protective gear as a Driver
 - ii. Be fitted and restrained as required for each Automobile with consideration for their physical attributes
 - iii. Complete a Passenger Ride Entry Form and disclaimer
 - iv. Drivers must fill out a Passenger Ride Entry Form to ride as a passenger.
 - v. Be at least 12 years of age
- (c) Vehicles and Apparel used must pass Scrutiny.
- (d) Vehicles shall only carry one Passenger at a time, unless otherwise approved by CAMS."

2.2 Licences

Any crew member may drive but must hold a current valid Driving Licence. The Competitor must hold a current and valid Cams Licence, current CAMS affiliated car club membership card and CAMS Vehicle Log book (if issued).

Those aged 12 -18 must have a valid 2NSJ Licence.

Social tour crews need only a valid Driving Licence.

3 Entries

Entries will open on publication of these regulations.

Entries must be made on the official Entry Form and sent to the Event secretary either by email or mail to the above address prior to the closing date of Friday June 8th.

Cheques should be made to AROCA. EFT details are provided on the Entry Form.

Entry Fee includes :

- Event Entry
- One only set of maps and instructions
- Lunch for 2 people

3.1 Entry fee is \$ 110 for each crew of two

An additional cost of \$35 for extra passengers.

3.2 Protests

Protests, if any, must be lodged in accordance with Part XII of the National Competition Rules of the CAMS. NCR Protests relating to the Event must be lodged within one half hour of the crew booking in at the end of the day.

4 Vehicles

4.1 All road registered vehicles will be eligible for entry to the Event

4.2 Equipment

Although not compulsory it is recommended you carry

Fire extinguisher

First aid kit

Safety triangles

A mobile phone should be carried in case of emergencies.

4.3 Banned Equipment

Any device that uses GPS or has electronically stored maps

5 Nature of the Event

5.1 The Event will be conducted on Sunday 24th June and the total length is approx. 300kms. There is about 6kms of good unsealed roads. The social tour will not be using any unsealed roads.

5.2 Schedule

Entries open on publication of these regulations and close 8TH June 2018.

5.3 Registration and Scrutineering

Scrutineering should be done before the Event if possible. There will be scrutineering from 7-7.30am on the day of the Event.

5.4 Start will be at Mittagong RSL Bessemer St Mittagong

Lunch at southern Highlands Winery Moss Vale

Finish at Sutton Forest Pub.

6 Registration requirements.

CAMS and civil licences MUST be shown at registration.

Completed scrutineering form

7 Route Instructions

Different instructions will be provided for each category.

7.1 Road card will be issued to all crews at the beginning of each Division and each Crew is responsible for their Road card.

Road cards must be surrendered to officials at certain controls.

7.2 All distances will be given in both kilometres and miles. The survey vehicle recorded a distance of 5.00km over a standard RMS distance check

8 Navigation

8.1 Only one set of maps and instructions will be issued to each crew.

8.2 Any definition or word usage in the maps legend takes precedence over common usage. The maps and the Legends are deemed to be correct.

8.3 The route is shortest mapped route overall.

This Event will be run under the rules of the NTC except for 2.20 which is replaced by: Shortest Mapped Route Overall is that mapped route which is the shortest between VIAs while visiting intermediate points between VIAs without using any part of the route in opposing directions. Intermediate points will not necessarily be passed through in the same order as that given in the route instructions.

8.4 Where the route instructions say pass, keep or leave a feature on the left or right this will refer to the road on which these features are on the map.

8.5 Where a road is intercepted by a name or map symbol then it will be deemed to join up underneath that name or symbol as a mapped road.

8.6 All reference points will be defined precisely eg. Bowral Post Office. In the Event of no precise point being given. the point will be defined as the centre of an underlined letter in a word eg. –Berrima

8.7 For each division maps will be named in order of priority

9 Controls

Control Boundaries will be defined by marker cones which will be a safety zone for the officials.

Passage controls must be entered on sight regardless of which direction they may have come from. A white board with a blue P indicates a passage control.

9.1 Questions

The answers to questions will be on the left hand side of the road in the correct direction of travel. Questions may be given in any order but the answers must be written in the corresponding correct numbered boxes.

10. Scoring

10.1 Breach of Rules /Penalties

The following breaches of the rules will result in the penalty of “Exclusion”

Non-payment of entry fee.

More than 30 minutes late at Start

False declaration Irregularity of crew or vehicle ID

Rally No. missing or altered Road card

Control area infringement

Excessive noise level

Carrying of banned equipment

Dangerous driving

Breach of CAMS Alcohol Policy, CAMS Anti-Doping Policy. (refer to CAMS website)

Acting in a manner detrimental to the interests of the sport.

10.2 General scale of infringements

A 30 points penalty shall be imposed for:

- A. missing or failing to report to Passage Control

- B. Entering or leaving a control in the wrong direction
- C. Excessive noise in a Quiet Zone
- D. Visiting a Passage Control More than the correct number of times
- E. Loss of Road Card
- F. Exceeding the late time limit for a section

Missing a VRC	12points
Missing or incorrect answers to questions	11points
Answers written in incorrect box	11points.

11 Results

Penalties will be expressed as points lost.

The crew with the lowest total of points lost in each category will be declared the winner. In the Event of a tie, the oldest car may be used as the tie breaker.

11.1 Trophies will be presented for the first three placings in each category except for the Social tour.

12 Alcohol, Drugs and other Substances

Any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of drugs (or other banned substances) and subject to a penalty(ies) for a breach in accordance with the CAMS Anti-Doping Policy and/or the CAMS Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy as published on the CAMS website. Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits or any section of the competition venue/course under the control of the Officials is forbidden until all competition is concluded each day. Accordingly, any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may also be tested for the presence of alcohol by a CAMS Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the CAMS Standard Operating Procedure for Breath Alcohol Testing.
