

TOUR d’COURSE 2019

Supplementary regulations

1 Administration:

1.1 Nature of the Event

The Event will be known as the Tour d’Course herein referred to as the Event and will be a multi club Navigational Assembly. This Event will be conducted on public roads in the Southern Highlands and South Coast areas of NSW on Sunday 23 June 2019.

There will be three competitive categories:

Masters

Apprentices

Tour.

Different instructions may be used in each category. A Social Run will also be held in conjunction with the Event but participants will not be eligible to score points in the CRC Championship.

1.2 Authority and Permit

This Event will be conducted under the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices and the National Competition Rules (NCR’s) of the Confederation of Australian Motor Sport Ltd (CAMS), CAMS National Touring Code, the CAMS Motor Sport Passenger Ride Activity Policy, these Supplementary Regulations, and any Further Regulations or Instructions which may be issued. This Event will be conducted under and in accordance with CAMS OH&S, CAMS Safety 1st and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the CAMS website at www.cams.com.au

The Navigational Assembly will be held under CAMS permit no.- 219/2306/03.

1.3 Promotor

The Event will be promoted by the Alfa Romeo Owners Club of Australia NSW Branch

1.5 Protests

Protests, if any, must be lodged in accordance with Part XII of the National Competition Rules of the CAMS. NCR Protests relating to the Event must be lodged within one half hour of the crew booking in at the end of the day.

1.6 Alteration, Abandonment or Termination of the Event

The organisers reserve the right to abandon, alter or terminate the Event at any time, in accordance with NRC 59

1.7 Odometer check:

The survey car measured 5kms over the 5.00km RMS odometer check on the Hume Highway heading south.

1.8 Event Format

The Event will be conducted over one day in 2 Divisions. The total length of the Event will be approximately 280kms on sealed roads except for 5kms of good unsealed roads. It is recommended that you start the Event with a full tank of fuel.

2 Crews and Entries

2.1 Crew Members

Crews will consist of a minimum 2 people and a maximum not more than the legal seating of the vehicle.

Non-participant passengers who are not officially entered in the Event do not need to have a CAMS competition licence and will not be covered by the CAMS personal insurance policy.

2.2 Licences

It is the Competitors responsibility to make sure that any crew member who drives the vehicle during the Event has a current driving licence. Crew members must hold a current minimum CAMS 2NS competition licence.

Social run participants do not need a CAMS licence and will not be covered by the CAMS personal insurance policy.

2.3 Entries

Entries open on publication of these regulations and close on 17th June 2019. The number of entries will be limited to 60.

The entry fee is \$115.00 Entries must be made on the official entry form and sent to the address or emailed listed in clause 1.4 of these regulations.

Entry fee includes:

Entry for crew of 2

One set per car of all official maps and instructions

One set of car numbers

Lunch for crew of 2. Additional crew members \$35.00 each

Changes in the crew and/or vehicle after the acceptance of entry will only permitted at the discretion of the Event Director. Any crew and/or vehicle that are changed after the start may continue in the Event but will not feature in the results.

It is a condition of entry that the car number is affixed to the car on the passenger side.

2.4 Start location and Starting order

The Event will start at the Mittagong RSL, Bessemer St Mittagong on Sunday morning and finish at the Sutton Forest Hotel Illawarra Hwy, Sutton Forest. Vehicles can start in any order within their category with the Masters leaving first, then Apprentices, Tour and Social. The start control will close at 9:30am.

2.5 Registration and Briefing

Registration will be done at the time listed in Section 4 of these regulations. The following documents must be presented at that time.

Civil drivers licence and minimum 2NS CAMS licence. This does not apply to the Social Run. CAMS affiliated club membership card for all participants.

A completed scrutineering form. If possible get this done before the Event although scrutineering will be available at the start venue.

If the vehicle has a log book this must be presented at registration and the appropriate information for the day filled in.

A crew briefing will be held at 8.15 am in the breakfast room of the Club. A member of each crew is required to attend the briefing. Samples of the various Control boards to be used during the Event will be shown at the briefing.

3 Vehicles

3.1 Eligibility of Vehicles

It is the Car Owners responsibility to ensure that the vehicle has current Full or Conditional road registration permitting its use on public roads and to ensure that it is in a road safe condition both at the start and during the Event.

A list of scrutineers can be found in the monthly CRC magazine .A valid pink slip, completed within one month before the Event is an acceptable alternative. Cars in the Social Run are not required to be scrutineered.

3.2 Equipment

It is strongly recommended that a fire extinguisher, a first aid kit, warning triangles and safety vests be carried in all cars.

A ruler and magnifying glass will be essential. A 1: 100 000 roamer would be also useful

3.3 Banned Equipment

Any device that shows current location on the surface of the earth, either graphically or in data form or that gives information so that such a location can be derived.

4 Schedule

Entries open on publication of these Regulations

Entries close Monday 17th June 2019

Sunday 23rd June 2019

Registration Please be early

8.30 am Drivers briefing followed by issue of instructions

12.00 First car to lunch-approximately
4.00pm First car finishes at Sutton Forest Hotel-approximately

5 Controls and Observers

5.1 Controls- refer to Chapter 4 of the CAMS NTC

All control boards and observations will be located on the left hand side of the road.

A VRC board, passage control or observation will be found in the first kilometre (0.621mls) of any section of unsealed road that is part of the correct route.

5.2 Observers

All control officials are deemed to be observers and judges of fact

6 Route Instructions

6.1 Masters and Apprentices will be provided with all maps and instructions to complete the course. Tour and Social run will use route charts. Note that routes may vary between categories.

6.2 Route instructions will generally be in accordance with Chapter 3 of CAMS NTC but with the following amendments and clarifications.

6.2a Clause 2.17(vii) of the NTC is amended to read: When instructed to pass a defined mapped feature you must use the closest mapped road to the described feature.

6.2b You may only use the roads that are shown on the official Event maps or those that may be advised as deemed mapped roads.

6.3 For all Categories

All controls must be entered and exited to comply with the instructions given.

Road cards will be issued to all cars at the start of each Division and each crew is responsible for their road card.

Various observations are recorded onto the road card, such as the answers to questions and recording information from VRC boards. Questions may be given in any order but the answers to numbered questions must be recorded in the similarly numbered boxes on the road card. If the answer to a question is found missing by the setup car, an upside down VRC will placed at the distance. The information on this VRC board must be written in the place of the answer to the question. All observations will be found on the left hand side of the road.

6.4 Abbreviations

Abbreviations as used in the Event route chart instructions will be listed on the information sheet issued at registration.

7 Scoring

7.1 Breach of Rules

A no start penalty will be imposed for non-payment of entry fee or more than 30 minutes late at the start.

7.2 The following may result in the penalty of Disqualification

Refer to NTC section 6.2 (a) and (b)

7.3 Points Penalties

Refer to Section 6.2 (c) of the NTC for points penalties.

Missing a VRC or the recording wrong information will incur a penalty of 11 points

Missing or wrong answers to questions will incur a penalty of 10 points

8 Results

Penalties shall be expressed in points lost. The crew with the lowest total in each category shall be the winner of that category.

9 Awards

Trophies will be presented for the first 3 placings in each competitive category.

No awards will presented to the Social Run participants.

10 Alcohol, Drugs and Other Substances

Any holder of a CAMS Competition or Officials licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of drugs (or other banned substances) and may subjected to penalties for a breach in accordance with the CAMS Anti-Doping Policy and/or the CAMS Illicit Drugs in Sport(Safety Testing) Policy as published on the CAMS website. Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits or any other portion of the competition venue/course under the control of the Officials is forbidden until all competition is concluded each day. Accordingly any holder of a CAMS Competition or Officials licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may also be tested for the presence of alcohol by a CAMS Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the CAMS Standard Operating Procedure for Breath Alcohol Testing.

11 Insurance
